



Style Guidelines for conference papers

Authors whose abstract was accepted by the program committee are kindly invited to submit full-text papers. The papers will be reviewed and published in the Conference proceedings. Registered authors are kindly invited to submit full-text papers giving a description of their research, including results, tables, figures, and references. All submitted papers should articulate original, unpublished research results, experimental or theoretical. Papers submitted to the Conference should meet these criteria and must not be under consideration for publication elsewhere. Manuscripts must follow the style of the Conference and will undergo both peer review and editing.

Authors who do not want a peer-reviewed paper, and are presenting a case study or similar work, will have their abstract printed.

All peer-reviewed papers will have assigned DOI number and will be published under open access article Creative Commons Attribution licence 3.0 (CC BY-SA 3.0).

The final submitted paper should be between min 4 and 6 A4 pages (and max. 10 pages) for a full paper review, and written in the English language (British or American.) Authors whose native language is not English are advised to seek and advice of native English speaker or to use proofreading software before submitting their manuscript.

Papers should be submitted as *.doc; *docx; *.rtf attachment to igor.karlovits@icp-lj.si as a mail attachment or via file transfer services if the original file exceeds 20MBs.

All figures and tables must be embedded into the file. For good printing quality resolution of (300 ppi) is recommended. In e-version, lower quality of images is also acceptable.

The final papers file name should be formatted as
Surnameof1stauthor_Surnameof2ndauthor_etc_Titleofthe paper.doc/docx. PDF or other types of formats are not acceptable, as well as locked files with no editing option.



For all authors, please provide ORCID ID number in the submitting email. If you do not have it, you can register at <https://orcid.org/>.

For the paper submission and preparation, we strongly advise to use the provided template on the conference website.

In case when that is not possible, please format your paper according to these requirements:

Paper naming Example:

Paper size: (170x240mm)

Margins (TOP 2,2cm; BOTTOM 2 cm, INSIDE 2,5 cm , OUTSIDE 2,2 cm)

The text should be formatted in the following type and sizes:

TITLE: Calibri Bold, 16pt, Uppercase, centered, italic

Authors: Calibri, 12pt, centered (First author, second author....) the authors from different institutions should be noted with an numer (^{1,2,3...}) with the the same style as authors name in the next row

Abstract: Calibri Italic, 11 pt, justified

Keywords: Calibri, 11pt, left align

Section title: Calibri 12 pt, left aligned, numbered (1,2,3...), space before and after 12pt

Text: Calibri 11pt, single spaced, justified

Figures and tables

Number all figures and tables and refer to them in the text as Figure 4 or Table 1. Titles in Calibri 10 pt, Italic should be placed bellow Figures (centered) and above Tables (align left). Text in Tables should be in Calibri 9 pt (italic).

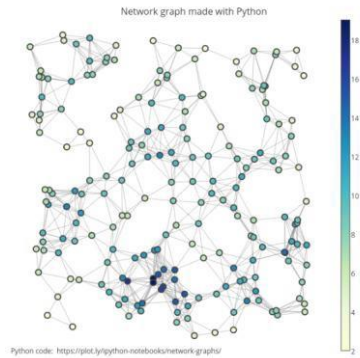


Figure 1: Simulation results of networking

References in the text should not be numbered, but should be indicated by the authors name and year (Surname, 1996); (Surname et al, 2010). The list of sources referred to in the text should be collected at the end of the paper in alphabetical order in Harvard Citation Style.
